CONSTITUTIONAL ★ AMENDMENTS ★

THE NEW CONSTITUTION AND THE AMENDMENTS

Ratification of Constitution. Voters must approve the changing of the Constitution of Alabama to remove racist language, organizing the local amendment by counties of application and grouping together amendments related to economic development.

AMENDMENT 1

This amendment, dubbed Aniah's Law, would allow judges to deny bail to defendants charged with a broad swath of violent offenses. The law is named after Aniah Blanchard, a college student who was abducted and killed in Auburn in 2019.

AMENDMENT 2

This Amendment would provide clarification for local governments on their ability to spend federal funds on broadband expansion. This includes allowing broadband grants of a thing a value of or to any individual, association or corporation.

AMENDMENT 5

This amendment deletes the outdated language in the constitution regarding orphan businesses.

AMENDMENT 6

This amendment would allow for municipalities to be able to use tax revenue for capital improvement projects with a pay as you go method instead of having to use money to pay off debt on the project.

AMENDMENT 7

In a similar vein as Amendment 2, this amendment would clean up and clarify state regulations for local governments and their economic development efforts. The constitution currently does not allow for municipalities to be able to give things of value to individuals or entities. This amendment would allow for an economic development exception to the current language. These changes would apply to all counties and cities regardless of the separate local constitutional amendments.

AMENDMENT 10

This amendments, would place all the new ratified amendments on the new constitution.
